- ◆ Participation in local protests to prevent/avoid local police from becoming an agent of ICE.
- ◆ Advocate/fight for local minimum wage, rent control for tenants, and other local needs.

- ◆ Gather with your neighbors to resolve any problems and organize.
- ◆ Learn and practice your rights, be observant in your neighborhood, fundraise through grassroots efforts to assist families affected by deportation, detention, and/or other impact.

What is a Local Committee?

It's a movement base including day workers, migrants, and low-income families. They build unity to address the fight for social justice and inclusion to advocate for labor and human rights as migrants and workers in these difficult times.

This is the reason we build our collective power to challenge anti-immigrant governments, corporations, and organizations. We need to unite and protect the seeds of a movement led by our migrant community.

What drives us?

Our migrant community continues to live with in the face of exploitation and dehumanization. We have reached a point where we must take action because no political power will do so.

We need to fight for our communities against extreme exploitation, fascism, authoritarianism, stigmatization, mass deportation, dehumanization, and discrimination.

Where will we form these local committees?

- ◆ Local working corners with Day Laborers, in our homes, apartments, churches, schools, local sports teams, neighbors, and folks in your community.
- ◆ With groups and organizations who have interest in local organizing.
- ◆ Wherever a group of migrants would like to meet to protect themselves from racist attacks.
- ◆ Where two or more people are ready to be part of the movement and fight.
